The beaches and coastal paths are quieter so it is a great time to go out walking and watch the harvest being gathered.

Fruits and berries are at their prime at this time of the year, all ripe and ready to be harvested. We have seen many people out walking in the countryside foraging for wild berries in the hedgerows. There has definitely been an abundance of blackberries and sloes in the countryside around Ringmore and Kingston this autumn. The blackberries are juicy and fresh now but towards the end of October they will lose their sweet taste so make sure you get out gathering your berries soon!

The National Trust orchard at Ringmore is full of wide variety of fruit trees that are now yielding delicious apples, pears and plums. Jane, one of our regular volunteers has been out picking the apples in the orchard and the juicy blackberries around Ringmore to make her very tasty blackberry and apple crumble. The recent stormy weather has meant the ranger team has been out checking the trees around Kingston and Ringmore, ensuring that no damage has been caused during the high winds. This is a safety procedure that is carried out after every storm in the high risk areas. PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Implementing the Parish Plan.

At last we have a village bottle bank. This was going to be the easiest action of the Plan, but did not quite work out that way! However, thanks to Tor Homes and the residents of Yellands, there is now a small bank in Yellands car park. Please use it and keep it clear of broken glass etc.

The Recreation Ground.

Some of you will have noticed we had a problem with the zipwire on the Recreation Ground recently. However all is now well and at no time was there any risk to safety. Finally the newly landscaped bank on the inside of the roadside hedge and the area around the new oak tree are wet enough to reseed and we hope to establish a wide range of native wildflowers among the grass. The tree wardens are still adding whips to the hedgerow and despite the early summer drought most of the new trees seem have survived.

The Devon County Council Locality Budget.

There were a number of applications to the PC for funding from the DCC budget, advertised in last month's Newsletter. We could not fund all of them and are sorry to disappoint some of you.

The PC has chosen the following projects on the basis of their benefit to residents:

-an Automatic External Defibrillator for Kingston from the SW Ambulance service including servicing, training and indemnity insurance for users. A defibrillator can restart someone's heart when it has stopped due to trauma and greatly increase their chances of survival. If you are interested in training to use this remarkable piece of equipment and it is really easy, please contact Neville Thomas on 811242.

-for KYPA: 'Stagecoach', a course of expert drama coaching sessions for our talented young residents.

-two extra filled grit boxes from SHDC for Vicarage corner and Kingston Plain. Once they are in place, refilling is at SHDC expense.

-fire proof stage curtains for the Reading Room. Thanks to Cllr. Carson who has given some SHDC funding towards this item.

Any further decisions are pending final costs on the above projects.

Footpaths

The National Trust have opened a new permissive path across farmland between Kingston and the south west coast path. There will be a map of this on the parish notice board and on the parish website, under 'walking in Kingston'.

Church News

We have now achieved a 'Diocesan Advisory Committee Certificate', approving the proposed access works to the church. There are still a few more forms to complete before we have their final agreement, but we can now apply to SHDC for planning permission for the main access ramp. We hope some minor works will be underway before the end of the year. Please come and join us in thanksgiving at the Harvest Festival. All proceeds to go to Shelter Box to support those who have no harvest to be thankful for and little to look forward to. Christmas is coming, but not for everyone. Fragrance in our lives

It seems that summer has finally been and gone although we may still get some good sunny days during the month. Summer holidays have been and gone and probably are now a distant memory, if we were lucky enough to get one. School holiday are well behind us and the prospect of the Christmas holidays are looming far too fast. The whole year is passing us by far too fast and will soon also have been and gone to be replaced by another that will pass by just as fast and so things come and things go. People come and go, possibly touching our lives just for a brief moment but having some influence on us just the same very often without us realising it. Most things then are transient but never the less they leave their mark.

Where then are the constants in our lives? We are all unique and therefore will have differing constants on which to rely. One of these must surely be God, our creator. He is constant throughout our lives and He loves us dearly no matter what we might do. Yes, of course He must get upset, as any parent will, whenever we do things that offend against His laws but He will forgive us if we are really sorry and ask Him to do so. We need to be aware of the guidance of the Holy Spirit, the third part of the Divine Trinity. The Holy Spirit is always there for us even though we may not realise it and cannot see Him. We can be aware of His presence with us and we can listen for the voice of God speaking through the Holy Spirit, advising us when we are likely to do a wrong thing.

One way of trying to understand how we might be aware of the Holy Spirit is to think of lavender although there are other examples that people may prefer. Lavender is one of the most delightful flowers in the garden. It has a lovely purplish-blue colour and is very fragrant. The uses of lavender are many and varied but it is generally accepted that its fragrance can aid people to unwind and relax, be less stressed. If we touch lavender either by accident or on purpose it leaves its scent on whatever has touched it. The scent of the lavender then goes with you everywhere. So it is with the Holy Spirit.

The Holy Spirit lives in us even though it is difficult to understand because the Spirit is something we cannot see. It is like the wind which we can hear, but cannot see, or the fragrance which we smell, but cannot see. After we have touched a lavender plant we will smell its scent on our hands and clothes, even though we cannot see it. The fragrance goes with us everywhere. The Holy Spirit is like that. He also goes with us everywhere, reminding us of the presence of God, helping us to make good choices and have a less stressful life.

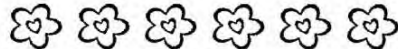

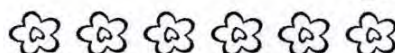
