Once again we have been having a very hectic month in and around Wembury. With the warm weather followed by the rain the vegetation has started growing like mad and we have to work hard to ensure all our paths are cut and clear.

On Saturday 10th July we had a fantastic farm cook out event at New Barton farm, promoting our food glorious food campaign which is promoting eating local produce. Over 100 people attended throughout the day. The agenda of the day was a tractor trailer ride, which was followed by a talk on stock judging and then a butchery and cookery demonstration, all meat provided by Moostone meats. As well as this we also had stalls from RSPB, the Chocolate Orchard and free beer samples from the landlord of the Foxhound in Brixton. It was a brilliant event which we hope to repeat next year.

Myself, Simon and Simon's boys enjoyed the Wembury carnival and school fair although some of you may not have recognised us in our fancy dress smurf outfits. We used our new engagement trailer for the first time which makes it easier for us to display our information. Any feedback about the trailer will be gratefully received.

We have had several enquiries regarding where to leave rubbish that people have kindly picked up off Ayrmer beach. Rubbish bags are available in the right hand compartment of the bin situated at the back of the beach. Litter collected can be left in this bin and subsequently picked up by the National Trust team as and when required. Many thanks to anyone who has kindly litter picked the beach.

On the 21st of August we have an allotment cook out event at Wembury allotment starting from 11am till 3pm. During the day chef Richard Mcgeown who was the chef at the New Barton cook out will be rustling up a few recipes using produce from the allotments and local farm shop produce. There will also be activities such as most amusing shaped vegetable competition, sun flower contest, plant and produce stall and a chance to discuss things with members of the allotment association committee and a lunchtime BBQ. Hope to see you there.

Also, just to mention that due to structural changes within the Trust the Yealm and Avon team have merged with the Salcombe team to make a South Devon Coast and Countryside team. This means that Simon Garner is now Head ranger for South Devon coast and countryside, with an area which ranges from Wembury in the West to Little Dartmouth in the East. Our office and workshop are now based over at Malborough. The workshop at Scobbiscombe has been vacated but No 3. Scobbiscombe Farm Cottage is still being used for volunteer accommodation.

Playing Field

The Council is delighted to report that the orders have now been placed for the new equipment. Sufficient funding has been sourced to allow us to complete all four phases of the development viz. 1) The aerial runway 2), The main play area, 3) The log cabin and picnic area 4) The Adventure Trail. The ground clearance is now complete and new turf has been laid where necessary.

Thanks are due to a number of people from Active Kingston, the Parish Council and Parishioners who have worked very hard to source funding, negotiate with Playdale Playgrounds Ltd, and arrange the ground clearance. Thanks also to those who provided the tub at the playground and took responsibility for watering the new turf in the recent hot weather.

KINGSTON READING ROOM MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE (KRRMC) DISABILITY DISCRIMINATION ACT (DDA)

In order to conform, as much as possible, with the DDA, Health & Safety and Fire Regulations the KRRMC have done the following:-

WHEELCHAIR: We have purchased a lightweight wheelchair, with a Grant by the Parish Council from the "Calor" money. This is to enable people with various mobility problems to have easier access and departure to/from the Reading Room. It also allows people with electric buggies etc or in cars who previously were unable to gain access to use the wheelchair to enter and leave the Reading Room. A Carer should always be in attendance.

The Wheelchair, together with instructions for use, is stored in the Disabled Toilet.

GATE: A Gate has been fitted at the top of the steps to the main entrance door to make entry and departure safer for wheelchair users. This gate should be kept closed and only opened when entering or leaving the Reading Room. This is primarily to improve safety for wheelchair users and their carers but will also enhance safety for all users.

HANDRAILS: Extra handrails have been fitted on both the Ramp and the Main Steps to aid access for all. It is also planned to paint the edges of both sets of steps, in a bright colour, to aid people with impaired vision, discussion on this with the RNIB is still to take place.

DOOR: We have a new door, with larger visibility panels made of specially laminated glass. This will minimise the risk of accidents to all Reading Room users and particularly those who enter/leave by wheelchair or have impaired vision.

CARERS/HELPERS: In view of the close proximity of the Reading Room entrances and exits to the road, we believe that, at all times, persons in a wheelchair should have a helper to

Gain access to the Reading Room

Assist whilst in Reading Room

Assist to leave/evacuate (in an emergency) the Reading Room

DOUBLE FIRE DOORS – We are still taking advice on making the steps from these doors safer should this be possible.

CLEANING – Both sets of steps and the ramp become slippery at times for varying reasons.

It is proposed that periodic extra cleaning/sterilising will take place to minimise any potential accidents.

To date, in excess of £1,000 has been spent on these improvements.

Once all this work is completed an Access Statement and an Evacuation Plan, as required by the regulations, will be finalised and displayed in the Reading Room.

**KINGSTON LOCAL HISTORY SOCIETY
NEWS FOR AUGUST/10**

We were very fortunate on our visit to Greenway House & Gardens on Saturday, June 24th as the sun shone all day & it was somewhat of a relief to tour the house first. It is an estate rich in history & the remains of an original dwelling were discovered during excavation to build the present Georgian house. It was originally the home of the Gilbert family. Sir Humphrey, a favourite of Elizabeth 1, took possession of Newfoundland for the Queen, whilst Sir John remained at Greenway becoming a lord lieutenant of Devon & a man of great local influence. The house was passed down through the ages until it was purchased by Agatha Christie & her husband, Max Mallowan, in 1938. It was originally their holiday home & a retreat from their main house in Torquay. It was rather a disappointment to learn that she had never written any of her books at Greenways. It is a collectors "Paradise" with snuff boxes, match box cases & vast quantities of china, to name but a few. The house was finally given to the National Trust in 2000 by Agatha Christie's daughter, Rosalind Hicks, & her grandson, Matthew Prichard. We walked down the winding path to Raleigh's boathouse on the banks of the River Dart. Here we were shown the "dust jacket" of the US edition of "Dead Man's Folly" & the scene of one of the novelist's fictional murders. It was an extremely interesting day.

A programme of events & speakers for the future is being planned & we would like to thank everyone who has given us suggestions & ideas. Also to thank all of you who have responded to my letter asking you for your memories of World War 2. We are hoping to put something together before the end of the year so please let us have your master pieces before the AGM in October, if possible.

Our next event will be an exhibition in the Church on August 7th during Fair day & will be entitled "People & Places in Kingston" based on the 1891 Census. A lot of hard work & research into the Archives goes into producing exhibitions so we hope you will find time to view it.

A reminder that the AGM will take place on Thursday, October 28th at 8.00 pm in the Reading Room. Jennie Stanley

“OH, I DO LIKE TO BE BESIDE THE SEASIDE”

There was a time, many, many years ago, when the word “holiday” meant a day trip to the seaside. Some of us can remember when the amount of money you could take abroad for your holiday was limited, and few people could venture further than the nearer part of Europe. Nowadays, we travel right across the world, soaking up sun, culture (and cheap booze!) and enjoying holiday activities of every description. I hope you enjoy yours as we shall ours!

For Christians, not just holidays, but every part of life is to be enjoyed. Joy is high on the list of spiritual gifts – signs that God is at work in us, so morose, miserable behaviour is the opposite of what God wants in us. Jesus was no killjoy; one of his first miracles was to turn water into wine at a wedding (what a pity vicars can’t copy this!). It was his desire to help people, and to demonstrate to them the love and care of God. Christians are Jesus people, and our task is to reflect Jesus in our lives and to tell others about him, wherever we are.

Whatever our choice of holiday, we will make sure we’re properly equipped, so the sun protection, skis or walking boots will be stuffed into our luggage. We agonise over what we’ve left behind: have we got our tickets, passports, vouchers and visas? But is the Bible packed in our suitcase alongside all the other essentials of a holiday? We take the local guide books with us; what about God’s guide book for life? Or does Jesus get left behind, confined to a small corner of our life at home? If we are churchgoers, do we search out somewhere to worship on Sunday when on holiday? Or do we give it a miss (“after all, we’re on holiday.”)?

Perhaps our experiences of holiday churches has put us off (my children will gladly regale you with horror stories from their past). If so, perhaps we ought to look critically at our own church services; will holiday visitors find us as welcoming and friendly as we would like to be? It mightn’t be a bad idea to ask a non-churchgoer to come along one Sunday and give us a constructively critical summary of his or her experiences. We value the presence and fellowship of summer visitors to our churches, and others will be similarly encouraged when we go to their churches whilst on holiday.

Living as we do in a part of the country where tourism plays a key part in the local economy, we have a seasonal mission field in the form of hundreds of holidaymakers. How can we reach out to them with the gospel? One answer comes from the football world cup. Supporters overflowed with infectious enthusiasm, bubbling over with talk of their team. If football supporters can be like that, why can’t Christians?
